From the Vatican on Behalf of Pope Francis

Dear Father Gay,

His Holiness Pope Francis was pleased to learn that the Congregation of the Mission will hold its General Assembly at De Paul University, Chicago, from 26 June to 15 July 2016, and he sends good wishes to you and all your brother Vincentians gathered for this important occasion.

As you reflect on your charism and the life of the Congregation, the Holy Father assures you of his spiritual closeness and prayers. Conscious that “the joy of the Gospel fills the hearts and lives of all who encounter Jesus... Dear Confreres,

In fraternal unity and full of hope, I cordially greet you at the beginning of your General Assembly. I pray the Lord to give you a heart open to the inspirations of the Spirit and generous enough to meet the challenges that, in this time of convulsions, the Church and the world place before your consciousness as heirs of the Vincentian charism.

Saint Vincent, a man of the Church, painfully felt its internal weaknesses and its absence in the world of human suffering. With all his zeal, he spent himself in lifting up the people from their misery, but he did not forget the internal problems of the Church, in particular, deficiencies in the formation of the clergy. He had a global vision of the spiritual situation of his time. He is, thus, an example and an invitation to the Congregation of the 21st century. There is, indeed, among us, a certain tendency to narrow the scope of our activity to the social domain alone, with the danger, because of insidious secularization, of seeing only material poverty and physical misery, forgetting the essential misery is that of overlooking God and the transcendent destiny of humankind. Saint Vincent warned the confreres against the people “of a narrow outlook.” We must not limit our field of action to the social domain. Let us be as large as Saint Vincent was, open to the needs of the Church and the world.

After 12 years of faithful service, Father Gregory Gay will leave the helm of the Congregation in other hands. For his tireless dedication to the Congregation and the Daughters of Charity, for his fraternal closeness to the confreres throughout the world, for his simplicity and goodness of heart, we owe him sincere and lasting gratitude. I cannot forget his close collaborators, the Vicar General, Francisco Javier Álvarez, the four Assistants, the Treasurer, and the Secretary General. To all, we say thank you. May the conviction of service accomplished, fill them with joy and give them strength for the missions to which the Lord will call them in the future.
