## Editor's Note: Vincentiana 2013

- Ten official responses from provinces, vice-provinces, and a mission to the questions posed by the 2011 letter of the Superior General;
- Several reflections from individual confreres engaged in parish ministry.

This above collection of articles, provincial statements, and reflections on Vincentian parish life forms a fine tableau of the diversity and richness of our charism. It also recalls the generosity of confreres across continents who faithfully serve the people of God in parishes. It is with regret that I note the absence of a number of provinces (and sadly, continents) from this discussion on Vincentian parish life. To be

clear, both provinces and confreres from across the world were invited to participate. Hopefully there will be future opportunities for sharing.

In this first issue of 2013, you'll notice a "new" item. Spotlight Interview is a new feature which will highlight a person who promotes Vincentian charism. The initial interviewee is Fr. John Rybolt, C.M., Province of the West, USA. John helped found the CIF program in Paris, and has pioneered considerable research and writing on Vincentian history and spirituality.
