## **AFRICA**

Angola: Construction of a garden and wall to feed catechists, the local community, and the missionaries (see picture)

Madagascar: Expansion of a forestry project to support the Foyer de Tanjomoha social service organization in Vohipeno (see picture)

Madagascar: Construction of a playground for children served by the Foyer de Tanjomoha social service organization in Vohipeno

Madagascar: Support for teacher salaries at five schools operated by the Foyer de Tanjomoha social service organization in Vohipeno

Mozambique: Purchase of a new Toyota pickup for the parish of São Pedro Juliano Eyamard in the town of Mavudzi-Bridge (see picture)

Mozambique: Scholarships for two students to attend the Jordon University in Tanzania to study theology

Nigeria: Construction of the ground floor of school hostel integrating deaf children with children of full hearing in Oraifite (see picture)

Nigeria: Start-up funding for DePaul Hope Social Center providing widows with vocational training and micro-loans

**India:** Construction of a primary-secondary school and retention wall in Bairabi Village in Mizoram State (*see picture F*)


**India:** Construction of a presbytery in the Yerravaran village in Andhra Pradesh State (see picture A)




# 2016 FINANCES

In 2016, the Vincentian Solidarity Office (VSO) obtained and/or distributed \$1,068,111 USD in support of 32 projects. The operational expenses of the VSO in 2016 amounted to \$.09 per dollar distributed. The projects supported were located in 17 different countries. The table below organizes the projects supported by the VSO in 2016 by type and activity.
